Currently, the Finance Division offers three ways for the public to search, review, and report on financial activities of the City.

## ACCOUNTING INTERNET PAGE

Financial Reports –

The accounting internet website ([www.slcgov.com/accounting](http://www.slcgov.com/accounting)) makes the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) available on-line. You may read the annual audit reports for individual departments or download the CAFR in its entirety.

Budget –

The current budget book may be viewed and downloaded at ([www.slcgov.com/finance/2009budget/](http://www.slcgov.com/finance/2009budget/)) by department, including Messages from the City Council and Mayor, Budget Highlights, and see a summary of key changes to the current fiscal year budget. This web page also has links to audio and video coverage of Salt Lake City Council meetings and presentations for the budget process.

## EXPENDITURE DISCLOSURE

The expenditure disclosure system allows anyone to search City spending by department or employee simply by entering a beginning date and ending date and selecting the name of the department or entering an employee name.

## FRAUD WASTE AND ABUSE

The Fraud Waste and Abuse website (<https://apps1.slcgov.com/ManagementServices/FraudReporting/>) may be used by citizens, City employees, and any person doing business with the City to report a situation that may result in the theft, waste, or abuse of City resources including:

- Theft of money, equipment, or material
- Record falsification
- Kickbacks & bribes
- Contractor fraud
- Using city equipment for personal business
- Leaving a city vehicle idling (except emergency vehicles)

All reports are made anonymously and kept confidential. You may make a report through the website or you may contact a member of the Salt Lake City Audit Review Team directly at 801-535-6464. The status and progress of your report will be maintained on the website and can be reviewed by entering the case number given to you when you make a report.

**Again, you may remain anonymous when reporting fraud, waste and abuse through this process.**
